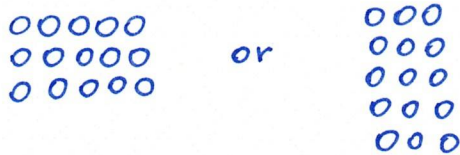


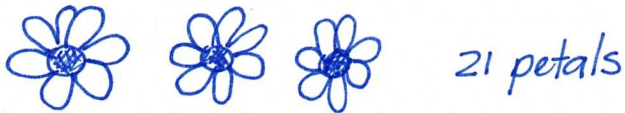
Interleaved practice

Number:

1. Draw 15 counters arranged as a rectangle.



2. Three flowers were growing. Each had 7 petals. How many petals altogether? Draw them.



3. What number comes before 30? **29**

Measurement/Geometry:

4. Draw the biggest coffee mug that you have in your house, next to the smallest glass or cup.

This will vary. Check that your child has correctly identified the biggest mug and smallest glass.

5. What time will it be when you go to bed?

This will vary. Your child might prefer to draw the hands on a clock.

6. Draw an object that is curved, but is not a ball.

check that your child has correctly identified a curved object eg. a cup, a rounded container, a bowl

Chance/Data:

7. Do you have more glasses or bowls in your kitchen? How many more? Write the number sentence and show your working.

Check that your child has correctly counted the items. The number sentence might look something like this $16 - 12 = 4$
